

Kerala likely to witness 10k to 20k cases per day during Aug-Sept: Health Minister

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM, AUG 14 /--/ Kerala is likely to witness a sharp rise in COVID-19 cases in the months of August and September with daily infections expected to touch between 10,000 to 20,000, state health minister K K Shailaja said. "Experts have opined that during the months of August and September we may witness a surge in COVID-19 cases. We may report between 10,000 to 20,000 cases per day," she said in a video campaign urging the youth to join the "Covid Brigade" to halt the pandemic spread. Noting that the death rate graph will start rising if the positive cases shoot up, the Minister said it should be stopped. "We must also understand that the death toll will increase with the rise in the number of cases. So, we need to put a hold on the rise in cases. For that the people must cooperate. They should strictly follow the health protocol of wearing masks, handwashing and social distancing in order to break the chain of virus from spreading," Shailaja said. India's first Covid-19 case was reported from the southern state on January 30 when a woman medical

student tested positive on her return to the state from Wuhan in China, the epicentre of the novel coronavirus. The second and third cases in the country were also Wuhan returnees. On May 5, the state had 500 cases, which doubled to 1000 by May 27. On July 4, Kerala reported 5000 cases, by

July 16 the state breached the 10,000 mark and by July 28, over 20,000 cases were reported. On Thursday, Kerala recorded 1,564 cases, taking the total infection tally to 39,708. Three deaths were also reported yesterday taking the toll to 129. Appealing to the youth to join the 'Covid Brigade,' which will become a

model to the world, she said thousands of health workers and other personnel are fighting the pandemic. There is a need for more volunteers -- both medical and non medical -- to come forward and join the war against the disease. Practitioners of modern medicine as well as ayurveda, homeo, dental along with lab technicians, pharmacists and nurses can join the brigade. "People from non-medical fields like MSW, MHA, MBA holders, are required for the fight and they should also register for joining our Covid Brigade. All those who wish to volunteer should register for joining. This historic move will be a model to the world," she pointed out. Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan had on July 23, announced the formation of the 'Covid Brigade' consisting of doctors, nurses, para medical staff and volunteers to man the First Line Treatment Centres (FLTC). "More people are needed to strengthen Covid defensive operations in view of the rising numbers of cases. We have worked out an integrated action plan," Vijayan had said. (PTI)

Health minister inaugurates blood donation camp at AIIMS

NEW DELHI, AUG 14 /--/ Noting that there has been a significant decline in the number of voluntary blood donations in view of COVID-19 and apprehensions about hospital environment, Union Health Minister Harsh Vardhan today appealed to people to come forward to donate blood. Blood is required for emergency surgeries, blood disorders like thalassemia, blood cancer and road accidents and trauma cases, he highlighted. "Hence the best way to serve human kind is voluntary blood donation," Vardhan said as he inaugurated a Voluntary Blood Donation Campaign at AIIMS here. The camp, organized by AIIMS on the eve of Independence Day, is dedicated to both soldiers

as well as COVID warriors who lost their life while safeguarding the country and its citizens, the health ministry said in a statement. Two families were invited as guests of honour - one family of a martyred soldier and one family of a fallen COVID warrior of AIIMS. On India's fight against COVID-19, Vardhan said India's continuously rising recovery rate and progressively falling case fatality rate have proven the success of the COVID-19 containment strategy followed by all states and UTs. "We have successfully ramped up our testing capacity which has crossed the 8.4 lakh milestone today with more than 1450 testing labs spread across the country. I have confidence in the

scientific developments taking place in the field of treatment and vaccines for COVID-19 and soon India will achieve more success in our fight against COVID-19," Vardhan was quoted as saying in the statement. At the blood donation camp, the Union Health Minister interacted with blood donors and awarded them certificates for contributing to the blood donation drive. He encouraged doctors and healthcare workers themselves to come up in large numbers on the eve of Independence Day to donate blood and save lives of patients. Vardhan also expressed satisfaction that all precautions were being ensured at the camp including arrangement of

face shields, masks, gloves etc, the statement said. Appreciating the initiative taken up by AIIMS, Vardhan said, On the eve of our 73rd Independence Day, this voluntary blood donation camp is a tribute to both fallen COVID white coat warriors and the Kargil martyrs. We must remember the ultimate sacrifice made by the COVID warriors including doctors, nurses or paramedical staff while saving people's lives in the pandemic. To mark the event, the family members of deceased COVID warrior Hiralal, who was a frontline health worker at AIIMS and family members of Kargil martyr Lance Naik Rajbir Singh were honoured for their sacrifice, the ministry said in the statement. I have not deviated from Cong stand on Ram temple: Nath

BHOPAL, AUG 14 /--/ Madhya Pradesh Congress president Kamal Nath today said he has just toed his party line on the Ram temple issue and called himself a "devout Hindu" who has respect for all other faiths. Nath was reacting to a Congress MP from Kerala

writing to party president Sonia Gandhi against senior leaders extending support to the construction of the temple in Ayodhya for which 'bhoomi puja' was performed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on August 5. TN Prathapan, the party's Lok Sabha MP from

Thrissur, in the letter to Gandhi, had questioned the support senior Congress leaders Nath and Digvijaya Singh extended to the construction of the temple, saying it is like "bowing low for temporary successes". An unfazed Nath said he has not deviated from the long-held party stand on the Ayodhya issue. I have stuck to the

stand taken by the first prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru ji and former PM Rajiv Gandhi on Ram temple. Nothing more should be read into it (recent statements on the issue)," he told news agency PTI at his residence when asked about Prathapan's letter. Rajivji got it (locks of Ram temple at Ayodhya) opened. We were

against the demolition of the Babri mosque. The Congress stand was clear that we will abide by the courts decision on it. That is it, the former chief minister said. "I had got the biggest Hanuman Temple built in Chhindwara (his home district). I am a devout Hindu who has immense respect for all other faiths," he said. (PTI)

COVID-19 situation not conducive to reopening of temples: Bombay HC

MUMBAI, AUG 14 /--/ Observing that the current situation was "not at all conducive" to reopening of places of worship, the Bombay High Court today refused to pass any interim order directing that temples in Maharashtra be opened for public. A bench of Chief Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice P V Tavadde said the COVID-19 situation in the state had not improved and people must therefore, pray at home. The bench was hearing a public interest litigation filed through advocate Dipesh Siroya seeking that the Maharashtra government be directed to reopen temples for public. The state government could open temples and allow only a limited number of worshippers at a time in accordance with its COVID-19 lockdown guidelines, Siroya argued. The bench,

however, asked Siroya which temple he considered personally, to be the "biggest?" "The biggest temple is humanity," Siroya said. To which, the bench responded saying, "If you have any love for humanity, do not press



for such prayers then." "For the love and safety of humanity, pray at home," it said. The state government pointed out that on August 12, it had submitted a detailed reply before

another bench of the high court explaining how COVID-19 cases were still on the rise and that opening temples or any other places of worship was not feasible currently. The state government said it had prohibited public gatherings for celebrations for Gudi Padwa and Janmashtami, and people had been asked to pray at home. When Siroya pointed out that several other states had reopened some places of worship, and that the COVID-19 situation in Maharashtra was improving, the bench said, it did not think the situation had improved. "If the situation improves, this temple of justice will be the first to open its doors to the public. The current situation is not at all conducive to opening doors (of places of worship) to the public," it said. (PTI)

Chennai flyovers to glitter under dynamic lighting project

CHENNAI, AUG 14 /--/ Several key flyovers and subways in this metropolis would soon sport dynamic lighting, displaying splashes of different hues to suit specific occasions with chief minister K Palaniswami today inaugurating a Rs 33 crore beautification project. The dynamic lighting system would illuminate flyovers and subways at 37 places with a variety of colours, which will change seamlessly, setting a new ambience and mood to suit occasions such as Independence Day. Marking the project launch at the Secretariat in the Fort St George premises, he turned on the lighting system at the iconic Napier Bridge and the busy Dr Radhakrishnan Salai flyover. It was taken up to "enhance the appearance, look and feel of the bridges, flyovers and the city", the

Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) said. As many as 15 flyovers/ Grade Separators one Road Over Bridge, 16 vehicular subways and five pedestrian subways will have the dynamic lighting, it said. The GCC, in a



statement, said on special occasions like Independence Day the bridges can be lit up showcasing the tri-colour. "On important occasions such as Autism Day, Breast

Cancer Awareness Day, Glaucoma, Down Syndrome, etc, the bridges can be lit according to the colours that signify the causes and could create awareness among the general public," it said. The work of illuminating all the

said. Deputy chief minister O Panneerselvam, Municipal administration minister S P Velumani, chief secretary K Shanmugam participated in the inaugural function. Multilayered security arrangements and a mandatory adherence to social distancing norms are in place for the 74th Independence Day celebrations at the Mughal-era Red Fort this year. A security ring, including NSG snipers, elite SWAT commandos and kite catchers, will be placed around the Red Fort from where Prime Minister Narendra Modi will address the nation. The Delhi Police has made multilayered arrangements in connection with the Independence Day celebrations. Necessary coordination has been made with other agencies like the NSG, SPG and ITBP. (PTI)
