He converted the breakpoint when Thiem made an unforced error and made it 3-3 with an easy hold, riding the momentum. Playing with a lot of energy and stinging strokes, those were the best two games that Nagal played as the gap between him and the top players was on display after that. Thiem, using his superior game shifted gears with remarkable ease, turning the tide with an immediate break and served out the set. Nagal lost his serve early again with Thiem getting a grip of his returns. The Austrian started to serve better and also unleashed his big-hittinggame, keeping the match in a tight grip. Thiem broke the 23-year-old Nagal one more time in the seventh with a cross court winner to serve at 5-2.

Nagal got when Thiem hit a backhand long on the third breakpoint but dropped his serve in the next to give his fancied opponent two-set advantage. Thiem wrapped up the match with ease even as Nagal kept finding winners here and there. He fought hard and saved a match point too, but it was clear that the young Indian's best was not enough to trouble the top guns. (PTI)

## Serena Williams sets up US Open showdown vs. Sloane Stephens

NEW YORK, SEP 4 /--/ Yes. straight sets again. And yes, she moved into an all-American showdown at the US Open against Sloane Stephens. Still, this victory did not quite go according to plan. Her serve only so-so at times, her footwork a bit off, Williams got by and got through Thursday night against an opponent ranked just 117th, beating Margarita Gasparyan 6-2, 6-4 and letting out a cry of "Yes!" at the end that reverberated in a nearly empty Arthur Ashe Stadium. It sounded more like relief than excitement.

The only thing holding me back is that I get frustrated," said Williams, who has won six of her 23 Grand Slam singles titles at Flushing Meadows and was the runner-up the past two years. "But I'm out here, I'm fighting. It was just a minor setback. If anything, it could help me know what not to do next time." That'll be Saturday against Stephens, champion. # Messi's father tells Spanish league his son is free to leave

Lionel Messi's father sent a letter to the Spanish league on Friday saying his son is free to leave Barcelona immediately without having to pay the 700 million euro (\$837 million) buyout clause.

The letter comes a few

days after the league said Messi was still under contract until June 2021 and could not leave without paying the penalty. In the letter, which was seen by The Associated Press, Jorge Messi disputed that and said the contract allows his son to leave for free at the end of the season, which this year was pushed back by the coronavirus pandemic. Lionel Messi invoked the clause to leave last week, shortly after the team's humiliating 8-2 loss Bayern Munich in the Champions quarterfinals. Barcelona claims the clause expired on June 10 and told Messi he had to stay until the end of his contract or pay the buyout clause. The letter by Jorge Messi, who is also Messi's agent, was sent two days after there was no agreement in a meeting between him and Barcelona president Josep

Bartomeu. Besides the

uncertainty over the future of Messi, Barcelona is still mired in crisis three weeks after the loss to Bayern Munich on Aug. 14. And there are few signs that the club is close to getting back on track a few weeks from the start of the new season. The club's immediate focus has been on trying to get Messi to change his mind about leaving. Bartomeu and incoming coach Ronald Koeman said the team's restructuring project revolved around the Argentine forward, so convincing him to stay is key to helping lift the club out of one of its worst crises ever. If Messi doesn't change his mind, a lengthy legal battle could ensue, further hurting Barcelona's restructuring process. The club will start its season against Villarreal in the Spanish league at the end of the month. It also remained unclear what would happen to the rest of the squad after "profound" changes to the first team were announced by Bartomeu and Koeman. Koeman said he wouldn't count on some key players anymore, including Ivan Rakitic, Arturo Vidal and Luis Suárez, a longtime Messi friend and possibly one of the reasons why he asked to leave. (AP)
